

## Workshop session I

### What does a Baltic cooperation in higher education mean for us?

*Workshop aims are discussion of the topic in national groups (each member university) and sharing **an understanding of Baltic cooperation in the BOVA network** among member universities. Guideline questions below will help you to start a discussion but you should not feel restricted by them only. Your ideas in any other aspects are more than welcome as well.*

*Before starting, workshop participants should elect workshop chairman and person who will present workshop results in a plenary session. Short presentation (up to 10 minutes length) giving an answer to question presented in the workshop title shall be prepared as an outcome from the workshop.*

#### Guiding questions:

1. What general benefits you see for your university from participation in the BOVA University network? Evaluate different periods.
2. What useless activities within the BOVA in last four years you can point? Maybe some activities were missed when looking from nowadays perspective?
3. What new activities you would propose for next decade in BOVA cooperation?
4. Do you consider activities listed below important (or opposite) for your university in the BOVA cooperation? Why? Make a look from the point of view of your university, rate them starting from the most important.
  - Baltic doctoral students at NOVA PhD courses;
  - Joint international Baltic doctoral courses;
  - Teacher and researcher training;
  - Joint international master programs;
  - Joint international master courses.
5. What other ongoing academic activities do you consider important in the BOVA cooperation?
6. What internal (both human and financial) resources, in your opinion, are needed to carry out activities mentioned in questions 4 and 5?
7. How you university may contribute the process?
8. What you would expect from three other partners in the BOVA network?
9. What you would expect from NOVA UN in the frame of NOVA-BOVA network?
